

#### INTRODUCTION AND SUBMITTAL OF APPLICATION

Section 4301.82 of the Ohio Revised Code (ORC) authorizes municipalities with a population of 35,000 or less to create a Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area (DORA) of up to 150 contiguous areas. The executive officer (Mayor) of the applicable Municipal Corporation must file an application with the Circleville City Council (City Council) that meets certain statutory requirements to create a DORA. Notice of the application filling must be provided in a newspaper of general circulation for two consecutive weeks. The initial publication of the notice must occur between 30 and 60 days prior to the City Council's vote to approve or disapprove the application by ordinance.

Attached to this application (Exhibit A) is a letter from Uptown Circleville Inc. requesting the City Council adopt legislation to create a DORA in a portion of Circleville, Ohio. In the wake of COVID-19 mandated shutdowns and restrictions, increased presence of experimental destinations in neighborhood communities and competition from major online and big box retailers, now more than ever we need to support the economic health of historic commercial business districts.

This application includes all information sufficient to apply for the DORA:



- V. Land use and zoning within the DORA.



## **PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY**

In accordance with O.R.C. 4301.82 (B)(5), the proposed requirements for ensuring public health and safety are included below:

## A. Signage:

- 1. All DORA signage shall use the logo and branding as shown in the attached Exhibit A, which may be updated from time to time by Uptown Circleville, with consent of the City.
- 2. Uptown Circleville shall provide temporary signage (i.e., sandwich boards), and arrange for placement identifying the DORA boundaries on the following streets.
  - Main Street (East and West boundaries.
  - ➢ High St. (North boundary)
  - Watt St. (East boundary)
  - Court Street (North and South boundaries)
- 3. Participating businesses shall post a sign with the Uptown Circleville logo in their front window stating their participation and DORA hours.
- 4. Participating businesses with a side/rear public entrance shall post signage thereon that DORA beverages are not permitted outside that entrance.
- Nonparticipating business shall post signs indicating DORA beverages are not allowed on their premises.

#### B. DORA - Identified Containers:

- Uptown Circleville shall determine an approved DORA—
  identified container, which may either have branding printed
  directly upon it, or may be a label/sticker for establishments
  to place upon their own plastic cups. All Dora-identified cups
  shall be plastic that is compostable and or recyclable.
- 2. All establishments within the DORA shall only serve DORA beverage in the DORA-identified container.

#### C. Law Enforcement:

- 1. With the exception of open-container provisions, the Circleville City Police shall enforce all laws and ordinances, including but not limited to public intoxication, disorderly conduct, serving alcohol to a minor, and littering laws.
- All establishments serving alcohol within the DORA shall monitor their entrances/exits. No alcoholic beverage shall be permitted outside the establishment unless in a DORAidentified container.
- The City of Circleville may, but shall have no obligation to, assign additional officers on a temporary or permanent basis.
- The Police Chief, in the Chief's sole discretion when necessary to preserve the public health and safety, my declare the DORA suspended.

#### D. Sanitation:

- Establishments with an alcohol license shall provide one large receptable inside their front entrance and available to the passing public, which the establishment's staff shall empty as necessary. Participating establishments without an alcohol license shall monitor their own trash needs and provide additional receptacles as necessary.
- All businesses within the DORA shall use their own staff to monitor the public sidewalk and other public areas around their business and remove DORA cups and otherwise keep the area clear of DORA cups.
- 3. The City of Circleville and Uptown Circleville do not anticipate the DORA will cause a significant increase in the trash produced, and therefore the City shall continue providing only it existing staff, without additional service times or personnel.
- Uptown Circleville shall contact the City for trash problems caused by DORA cups, and to otherwise educate/communicate with business owners regarding their sanitation responsibilities.

# E. Public Safety - Fire/Ems

- 1. Circleville Fire Department will continue to provide the existing Fire, Rescue and EMS services within the DORA, with the existing number of personnel, and without an increase in services or personnel.
- For planned events in the DORA drawing large attendance and/or for which streets may be closed, the Fire Chief, at the Chief's sole discretion, may stage personnel and/or equipment in a location within or near the DORA to allow for an immediate response.
- 3. The Fire Chief, in the Chief's sole discretion when necessary to preserve the public health and safety, may declare the DORA suspended.

# **NATURE OF ESTABLISHMENTS**

In accordance with ORC 4301.82(B) (@) the nature and types of Establishments that will be located in the DORA are primarily Businesses in retail shops, food service, or in the service provider sectors.

# Land use and zoning within the DORA

In accordance with ORC 4301.82(B)(4) the uses of land within the DORA are zoned as DB (Downtown Business) **permitted uses** are (Section 23.02):

- A. Any use specified as a permitted use in Section 22.02 A through D, but not including uses with drive-through facilities.
- B. Hotels and Bed-and-Breakfast establishments.
- C. Community facilities such as governmental offices, post office, libraries, museums, private schools, public parks and similar uses.
- D. Churches and place of public assembly.
- E. Similar uses, which conform to the purpose of the Downtown Business District, as determined by the Board of Zoning Appeals.

#### Section 22.02

- A. The downtown should contain a healthy mix of land uses. The market place-not regulations-should be the primary force driving the mix of downtown uses.
- B. The downtown should be particularly receptive to small local-based entrepreneurship and start-up businesses.
- C. Housing-and particularly owner- occupied housing should be an integral component of the physical fabric of areas adjacent to and around the downtown.
- D. The maintenance and improvement of the downtown physical environment is important in promoting an active and vital business environment.
