2017 Goals Review

1. Code enforcement – complete a review of current codes (zoning, property maintenance and nuisance abatement) and recommend any revisions. Review potential revenue sources and develop a proposed job description. Review of possible grant funds.
2. Downtown Revitalization District – The Long Range Planning Committee assisted by the Mayor will lead an exploration of a DRD and the potential for a Heritage Ohio collaboration involving the Chamber and the Visitors' Bureau. The development of a 501(C)(3) entity will be considered.
3. Circleville Economic Indicators – Pickaway Progress Partnership will share with Council quarterly updates on the community economic indicators. Auditor will share work bond counsel has done in preparing for our bond refinancing.

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4. Capital Funds – The Mayor will present a recommendation for the use of up to \$100,000 in voted capital funds for park improvements to be initiated in 2017.
