An Ordinance To Amend Ordinance Number 02-07 2017 Authorizing The Mayor Of The City Of Circleville To Change The Pledge Amount and Enter Into A Pledge Agreement For Economic Development Service With Pickaway Progress Partnership. This was reviewed in the Committee of Whole Mtg. This is a financial pledge to Pickaway Progress Partnership for the next five years.

An Ordinance Authorizing The Director Of Public Service To Purchase A Mowing Tractor Utilizing The Sourcewell Cooperative Purchasing Program For The Department Of Public Service And Declaring An Emergency. This was reviewed in the Finance meeting. This is the financial legislation to purchase a mowing tractor for the Service Department.

An Ordinance Amending The Annual Appropriation Ordinance In The General Fund 101, Circleville Cable TV Fund 211, And The Park Improvement Debt Issuance Fund 252, Of The City Of Circleville. This was reviewed in the Finance meeting. This is housekeeping legislation.

UNDER NEW BUSINESS

- Hallinin motioned to approve the text of Council's Rule 25. Council Appointments, with amendments. Brady seconded. All Yeas.
Blanton motioned to amend Council Rules 25 Council Appointments, from Pickaway County Health District Board to "Pickaway County Board of Health." Hallinin seconded. Motion carried. Hallinin motioned for a second reading for Council Rule 25 with said amendments on May 16th. Brady Seconded. Roll call. (7 Yeas - 0 Nays). Motion carried.
- The Mayor stated that Tim Colburn is the New Health Commissioner of the Health Department. The Mayor is the new chair of the District Advisory Council (DAC). The DAC is made up of townships, villages, and the City. A new 2022 five (5) year contract was signed last year for the Board Of Health that was approved by the Law Director, County Prosecutor Attorney and DAC Mayor and Chair. The City's portion payments have decreased from 50% to 40% which has caused the City to have only two (2) board appointments, and the villages/townships now have five (5) appointments. The DAC has a vacant position and would like to appoint Brenda Strittmatter to the DAC.

Blanton motioned to adjourn the Council meeting at 7:31 pm, seconded by Hallinin. Motion carried.
