

CIRCLEVILLE JUDICIAL COMMITTEE MINUTES 8-22-2023

Circleville Judicial Committee convened in City Council Chambers, 127 South Court St, Circleville, OH. Tuesday, August 22, 2023, at 6:45 pm. Roll call. Present were Jeff Hallinin, Chair; and Cmte members Michelle Blanton and Tom Duvall. Others present Katie Logan Hedges; Todd Brady and Sheri Theis. Clerks Linda Chancey and Melissa Burns. Invited Guests Mayor Don McIlroy.

Hallinin called the meeting to order at 6:45 p.m.

Duvall motioned to approve the July 18, 2023, minutes. Blanton seconded. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS – Ordinances/Resolutions from Administration

A Resolution Authorizing Uptown Circleville Mainstreet Program To Use City Streets For Their First Friday Events And Declaring An Emergency. Jenny Rhoads explain First Friday's events are very successful, but we need extra street space that's why we asked for Pinckney St.

MOTION - ROLL CALL – VOTE

Blanton motioned to forward to the September 5, 2023, Council Meeting for passage. Duvall seconded. Roll call. (3 Yeas – 0 Nays). Motion carried.

A Resolution Authorizing The City Of Circleville Youth Leagues To Utilize Ted Lewis Park For The Purpose Of Parking Vehicles During The 2023 Pumpkin Show And Declaring An Emergency.

Hallinin stated this is annual resolution for parking vehicles at Ted Lewis Park. The Council asks that they leave the park as it was before.

MOTION - ROLL CALL – VOTE

Duvall motioned to forward to the September 5, 2023, Council Meeting for passage. Blanton seconded. Roll call. (3 Yeas – 0 Nays). Motion carried.

An Ordinance Authorizing The Mayor Of The City Of Circleville To Enter Into A Contract With The Pickaway County Visitor Bureau For The Lease Of 255 West Main Street, Circleville, Ohio.

Hallinin explained that the City leases the building to the Visitor Bureau. The address needs to be corrected to say 325 West Main St. The Mayor explained the lease is for 25 years, the contract stated the center will make remodeling the building. Rhoads explained the remodel includes new flooring and more friendly meeting space with outsidings repairs. There are nonprofits in the area that have twenty-five-year leases too.

MOTION - ROLL CALL – VOTE

Blanton motioned to forward to the September 5, 2023, Council meeting for passage. Duvall seconded. Roll call. (3 Yeas – 0 Nays). Motion carried.

An Ordinance Authorizing The Director Of Public Safety Of The City Of Circleville To Solicit Bids And To Enter Into A Contract With The Lowest And Best Bidder After Advertisement For The Trapping And Disposal Of Nuisance Animals Within The City And Declaring An Emergency.

Duvall explains this is a problem in the City with animals being aggressive to people and other animals. This will be bid for lowest cost per animal. The funding is stated in the ordinance.

MOTION - ROLL CALL – VOTE

Blanton motioned to forward to the September 5, 2023, Council meeting, recommended for three readings for more information and input from the public. Duvall seconded. Roll call. (3 Yeas – 0 Nays). Motion carried.

Andi Humphries President of Circleville Alumni Association – Bronze tiger statue.

Humphries explained the CHS Alumni Association would like to have a tiger statue placed in the roundabout near the City School with the Council's permission. The insurance will be paid for by the CHS. The Mayor suggested cameras and lighting on the statute for security.

Hallinin explained that he will get with the Law Director to draft an ordinance. The consensus of the committee was to move it forward to the September 5th Council meeting.

Any Other Business – none was discussed.

Duvall motioned to adjourn the Judicial mtg at 7:07 p.m., Blanton seconded.
